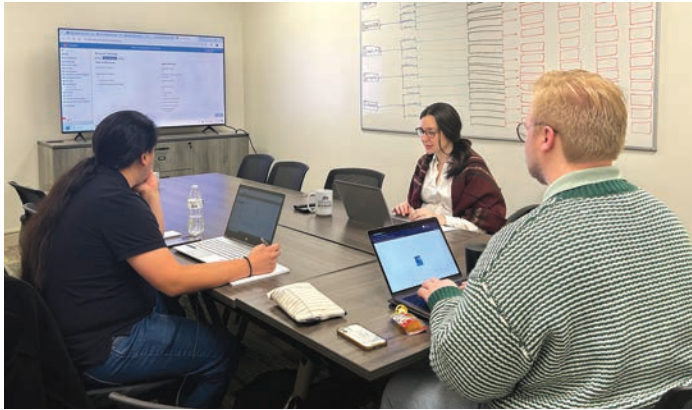


Cultivating the Future: Mosaic's Commitment to Training Compassionate Clinicians

Through hands-on experience, supervision, and mentorship, we prepare new clinicians to serve with both technical expertise and deep compassion for their clients.

A Training Program Rooted in Excellence

At Mosaic, professional growth is inseparable from personal reflection. Our program integrates clinical education, practical experience, and self-exploration, ensuring that trainees step into the field with both competence and heart. Core elements include:

- Supervision & Mentorship – Weekly individual and group supervision sessions provide guidance, helping trainees bridge academic knowledge with real-world application. Support and feedback are consistent, equipping them to do meaningful work.
- Educational Development – Our training explores diverse theoretical approaches to counseling, appropriate interventions across the lifespan, and learning focused on the specific needs of different populations.

- Experiential Learning – Interns and associates work directly with clients, shadow seasoned therapists, and gain experience with different treatment modalities while working with clients from diverse cultures, backgrounds, and lived experiences.

A Holistic Approach to Clinician Development

Beyond clinical training, Mosaic cultivates self-awareness, social responsibility, and a commitment to justice in mental health care. Trainees engage in:

- SERT Groups (Spirituality, Existentialism, Religion, and Theology) – A space for clinicians to reflect on their own beliefs, biases, and meaning-making systems, allowing them to hold space for clients' unique concerns with openness and depth.
- Non-Profit Mental Health Work – A closer look at the complexities of providing affordable, accessible care within a non-profit setting, including navigating systemic and administrative challenges.
- Justice-Oriented Practice – A focus on advocating for equitable mental health services and broadening access to care in our community.

Extending Our Impact

Through partnerships with institutions like UT Tyler, we strengthen clinical education by bridging academic learning with hands-on experience. Many of our former trainees continue their work at Mosaic, while others bring our values into diverse practice settings across East Texas.

Over the past year, Mosaic's clinical supervisors have invested more than 500 hours in training and mentoring, nurturing the next generation of mental health professionals. By investing in these clinicians, our work extends beyond the clients we see daily, creating a legacy of hope, healing, growth, and joy.

Without a doubt, 2024 left us speechless. The seed planted years ago – born from our community's call to expand mental health care – has blossomed into the thriving organization you're reading about today. But let's take a step back.

In 2018, we shared a home at 218 N. College with a sister nonprofit, but both of us were outgrowing the space. Fifty people shared a handful of parking spaces, our counselors rotated offices, and our waitlist grew – but we had nowhere to see them. Video therapy had yet to emerge, and graduate students we trained could only work Saturdays.

Then came COVID. I'll spare you that part – because we all lived through it.

Our clients needed space. Our students needed a place to learn. The Mosaic Board of Directors and I took on one of the biggest challenges a nonprofit can face – acquiring a space to meet both current and future needs. As the plan took shape, support followed. Our community rallied behind us, and in July 2024, we purchased our forever home at 6141 Paluxy Drive.

With a wooded drive and ample parking, our new space has everything clients need to heal – office space, student training rooms, group areas, a separate space for youth and family clients, private counseling rooms, and room to grow.

From the beginning, we envisioned a space that could also house other mental health organizations. Through collaboration, our goal is to enhance services and shift how we address gaps in East Texas' mental health system.

We are incredibly grateful to those who helped bring this dream to life. Many donors recently attended a sneak preview, and it was a joy to see them tour the facility. If you missed it, mark your calendars for our Community Open House on **Saturday, May 3, 2025.**

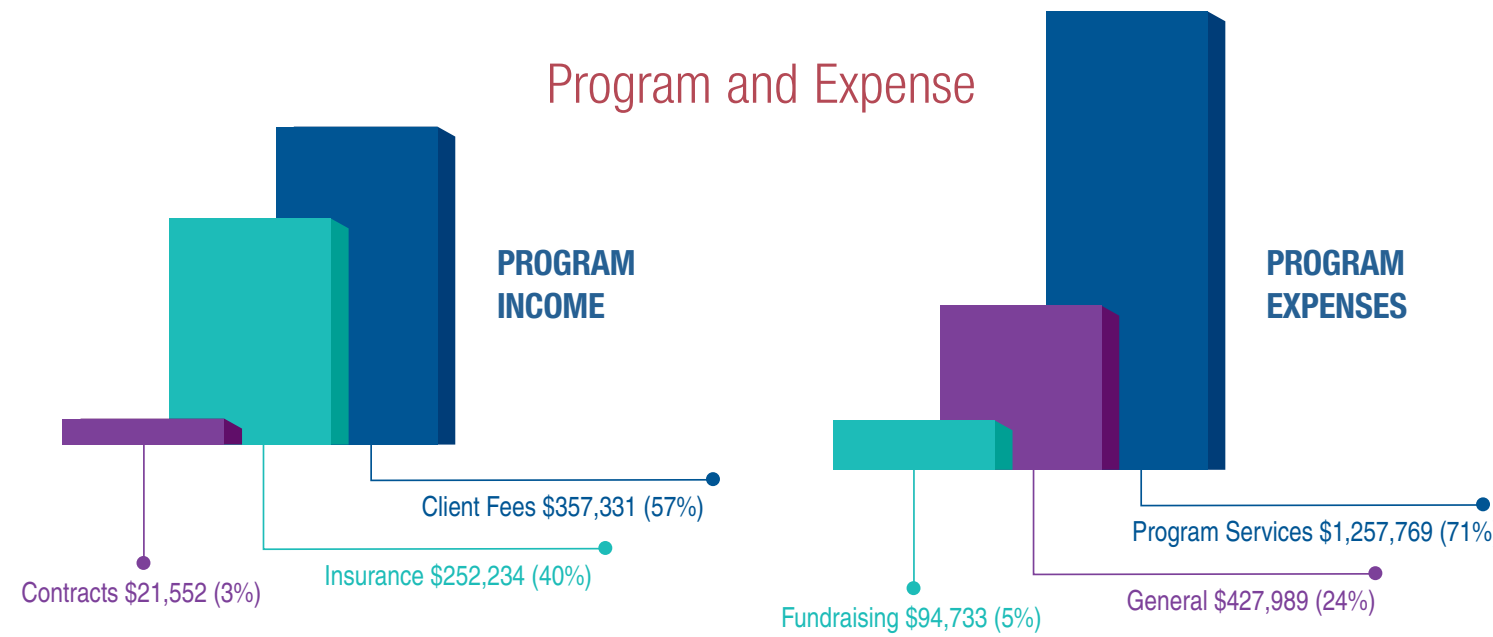

Program and Expense



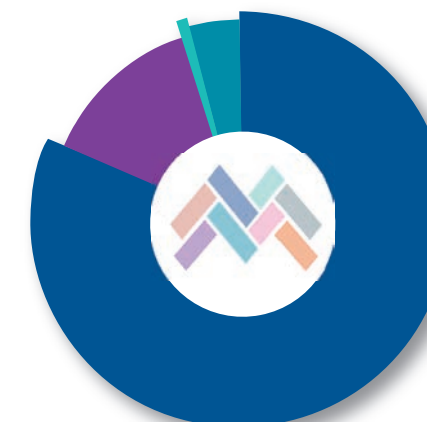
